SF State Undergraduate Academic Probation Hold Clearance Form Instructions

To be in good academic standing, you must maintain a SF State GPA and Combined Cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher. Because one or both of your GPAs was below a 2.0, an Academic Probation Hold has been placed on your record. Below are the steps to clear this probation hold so you can enroll in classes for next semester.

- 1) Follow steps A-E below to fill out this form electronically and then print.
 - a) Fill out your basic identifying and contact information at the top of the form.
 - b) View your unofficial transcript through your student center to identify your SF State and Combined Cumulative GPAs at the bottom, lower left area of your transcript.
 - c) Circle or add any group affiliations you have on campus that can help support you here at SF State.
 - d) Answer the prompt to question 1. Plan on discussing this further with your advisor.
 - e) Answer the prompt to question 2. Note that you can select a maximum of 13 units next semester because of your academic standing.

- 2) If you are declared in a major you plan to remain in, visit your College Resource Center to identify the advisor to help you complete Part B. If you are not declared with a major or if you are currently in a major you are not happy with, schedule an appointment in the Undergraduate Advising Center or EOP Office. Your advisor will help fill out part B of your petition.
 - a) In preparation for your appointment, you should visit advisinghub.sfsu.edu and read through the probation information. Use the grade point deficit calculator to determine your grade point deficit. Using the chart on the website, you will be able to identify the type of grades you need to earn to attain good standing.
 - b) Your advisor will help fill out Part B and will review and sign your petition if they support the removal of your academic hold.
 - c) Sign and date the student signature section of the form. The fully approved Academic Probation Clearance Form will support the release of your registration hold. Your grades this semester must be satisfactory to assure your enrollment next semester.

- 3) Follow the procedures outlined by your advisor to get the signatures from the Department Chair and the College Dean or Designee. They will review the petition and if supported, they will sign and forward the document for removal of your Academic Probation hold. Typically, this can take up to 2 weeks.

- 4) After allowing sufficient time for this form to be processed, you can check your Holds & Alerts box in your Student Center to see that your hold has been removed. You should also check that you do not have any other Holds to ensure you will be able to register during your priority enrollment appointment time.
